Week One
Dinner with Sinners
Matthew 9:9-13

The truth is, we’ve all made bad choices, but Jesus still wants us to love each other and spend time with each other. Jesus wants us to love everyone.

Week Two
Jesus Heals
Matthew 9:27-31; 12:9-14; John 5:1-15

This week, preschoolers will hear three stories of Jesus healing people who were sick, and they’ll learn that Jesus can do anything.

Week Three
The Unforgiving Servant
Matthew 18:21-35

When you forgive people, it doesn’t just change their life — it changes yours. This week, preschoolers will hear the story of the unforgiving servant and learn that Jesus wants me to forgive.

Week Four
Prodigal Son
Luke 15:11-24


Any time we ask for forgiveness, God says, “Welcome home!” This week, preschoolers will hear the story of the Prodigal Son and learn that Jesus wants me to forgive.

Preschool

Ask your child . . .

Week One

What was your favorite part of the Bible story today?


 Deeper in the conversation

Encourage your child to respond to the following prompt:

Draw a picture of a cross. Today we talked about how much Jesus loves us! When we tell Jesus about our bad choices (sins) and ask for forgiveness, He makes those sins go away. Say a prayer and ask God to forgive you.

Week Two

How has Jesus used His power to help you?


 Deeper in the conversation

Encourage your child to respond to the following prompt:

think about why you love Jesus so much. Draw a picture of yourself holding hands with Jesus. Say a prayer and tell Jesus how much you love Him.

Week Three

What does it mean to forgive someone?


 Deeper in the conversation

Encourage your child to respond to the following prompt:

Draw a picture of how you look when someone does something mean to you. Say a prayer and tell God you forgive them.

Week Four

What was your favorite part of the Bible story today?

 Deeper in the conversation

Encourage your child to respond to the following prompt:

Draw a happy face. When we say, “I’m sorry” to God, He is so, so happy. Say a prayer and tell God, “I’m sorry” for the bad choices you’ve made.
